First Aid Kit will be available. Snake bite specific first aid kit is available. Children will be taught about respect for the natural environment we are in at Seawinds Gardens. They will understand we are in the animal's habitat and be taught to move slowly, observe the animals and respect their space. Snake safety education will be taught to the children before entering this environment. Children are taught to check for snakes when climbing over logs, moving through leaf litter and grasses, check closely when picking up sticks. If they encounter a snake then children will be taught to stand still, warn their peers and teachers with their voice and slowly back away from the snake if possible. If children are approached by an animal they will be taught to stand still and look down at the ground so as to appear none threatening.	staff and parents

Children are considered to be capable and make considered decisions regarding their safety and vicinity to an adult. This autonomy and trust will be instilled into the children from day one of the bush kinder program.	staff and parent volunteers	
Toileting	Accessing toileting facilities safely and with supervision	Low	Children will be able to access the public toilets with the assistance of an adult. Children will also be introduced to the idea of a "bush wee". This is something that will be introduced at the beginning of the program so children's abilities and confidence with this will develop. Teachers will assist with this developing confidence and will instruct children on how this is done, assist with choosing appropriate places in the bush and using a privacy screen, such as a towel, if the child chooses.	staff
